# Pike Haven Resort Multi-species Fishing Tournament

## *Rules and Regulations*

**ELIGIBILITY:** The tournament is open to anyone with a valid South Dakota fishing license. Contestants must enter as teams, complete and sign an official entry form and pay the entry fee of \$100.00 per team. Contestants must check in at the rules meeting on Thursday, August 7, 2008, at 7:30 p.m. at the Pike Haven Resort Restaurant.

**SAFETY:** All boats will be required to meet U.S. Coast Guard safety regulations as well as those of South Dakota. Safe boating conduct and all safety precautions must be observed at all times. Each contestant will be required to have a U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD). It must be worn and fastened at the start of each tournament day. Drunkenness by any contestant during the tournament hours will not be tolerated and shall be cause for disqualification. In the event of thunderstorms or lightning, contestants are allowed to put into the nearest shoreline until it is safe to continue fishing.

**TACKLE AND EQUIPMENT:** All fish must be caught live and in a conventional sporting manner on hook and line. Artificial and live lures may be used. Each contestant may use two fishing rods. Only two persons allowed per boat (fishing entrants only).

**FISHING AREA AND BOUNDARIES:** Lake Oahe. South Boundary: Oahe Dam; North Boundary: U.S. Highway 212 bridge. Boats may launch from any boat ramp within the boundary area subject to the FISHING HOURS rules below.

**FISHING HOURS:** Tournament fishing hours are from 8 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on both days of the tournament. Contestants launching from ramps other than the Pike Haven Resort ramp must abide by the following rules: towed boats may not leave Pike Haven Resort earlier than 20 minutes prior to the tournament hours and must check in at the weigh station by the check in time. Boats launching from the Pike Haven Resort boat ramp may be on the water in the bay awaiting the official start signal, but may not fish until the start signal. Boats launching from the Pike Haven Resort ramp may check in with tournament officials at the ramp no later than 5:00 p.m., but cease fishing and remain in the bay until their boat is trailered. Details will be explained at the rules meeting.

**INSPECTION:** All teams are subject to inspection during the tournament and patrol boats may conduct inspections at any time.

**SCORING:** Prizes will be awarded to two-person teams. Prizes will be based on most combined two-day weight, pounds and ounces. Twelve fish will be weighed each day as follows:

- Walleye or Sauger – 3
- Smallmouth Bass – 3
- Catfish – 2
- Salmon or Rainbow Trout – 2
- Northern Pike – 1
- Rough fish – 1

Prizes will be awarded for the largest fish weighed in each species category.

**PROTESTS:** Protests must be filed in writing with the tournament director in person no later than 1/2 hour after close of that fishing day. A three-person protest committee will convene to hear both sides of the issue. Their decision shall be final in all cases. Anyone found cheating will be immediately disqualified and the reason for the disqualification announced at the weigh-in.

**MISCELLANEOUS:** All state laws, fishing and boating regulations apply.

In the interest of good sportsmanship, it is expected competitors will not crowd nor impede each other. No contestant boat may pull up to another contestant boat during tournament hours.

Disqualifications for any reason will result in forfeiture of entry fee.
